





Total Credit Hours: Shows progress towards the total number of credit hours required (124 hours minimum; additional hours required for B.S. Engineering)

Cumulative GPA: Shows the Overall GPA (at least a 2.0 is required)








4. Requirements at a Glance: Below the advisor assignment is a view of the audit "at a glance". The overall status of the audit is at the top followed by each required element of the degree.





6. The **30 Upper Division Hour Requirement:** a minimum of 30 Upper Division credit hours are required.



7. The 62 hour Residency Requirement: Counts only courses taken AT Trinity University.



- Transfer students must complete the residency requirement regardless of the number of credits transferred.
- **8. First Year Experience:** All incoming students must complete one First-Year Experience during their first semester at Trinity. A new transfer student with 26 credit hours of transfer credit or whose high school graduation date is a year or more prior to his or her matriculation at Trinity is exempted from the First-Year Experience requirement.



9. Approaches to Creation and Analysis: There are a total of 5 sub requirements, including: Humanities (HU), Creative Expression (CE), Social and Behavioral Science (SBS), Natural Science (NS), and Quantitative Reasoning (QR).

Interdisciplinary Clusters

Complete 3 courses(totaling no fewer than 9 credit hrs) from three discipline/subject areas. All courses must be taken AT Trinity and one of these courses may be used to fulfill the requirements of the student's primary major.
